
What does this mean for you?



- 1. The drop in accuracy means some records are going to be harder to find in 1950
- 2. Corrections to the transcription become very important to improve the overall accuracy of AI transcribed records
- 3. Using a second index can help you find names that are mis-transcribed in the first index you try




